Our students are the first children in the country who are working towards gaining their Digital Licence through learning and demonstrating their clear understanding of what it is to be safe online. We were also very honoured to host the CEO of the Alanah and Madeline Foundation who have designed and developed these resources present at the launch. Many thanks to Karyn Phillips for her tireless work in the eSafety Space which was recognised through our school being chosen for this initiative. eSmart Digital Licence launch, October 2024

Key Messages & Background

- This month the Alannah & Madeline Foundation launched eSmart Digital Licence for lower primary school students (Years: Foundation/Prep - grade 4, Ages: 4-9 years) in time for Media Literacy Week (Oct 21 –25).
- eSmart is Australia's trusted provider of online safety. eSmart gives schools, educators and families
 the tools they need to help keep students safe, smart and responsible in a digital world through free
 and updated resources aligned with the national curriculum.
- eSmart is an initiative of the Alannah & Madeline Foundation, a national not-for-profit organisation dedicated to keeping children and young people free from violence and trauma wherever they live, learn and play.
- In 2022, the Australian Federal Government (Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications, and the Arts) committed \$6 million in funding to the Alannah & Madeline Foundation to make eSmart programs available free of charge to all Australian schools.
- Children encounter digital technology from a young age. One-third of children aged six to 13 own a
 smartphone, and there is a clear need to teach them how to use this technology safely and
 responsibly. eSmart helps educators and school communities achieve this through resources and
 lesson plans that are evidence-based, age-appropriate, and aligned with the national curriculum.
- The eSmart program embraces a tech-positive approach, recognising the immense benefits of technology, while also addressing the risks learners face online.
- Over 1,000 school children across Australia including students from Chelsea Primary School were in
 engaged in the co-design of the eSmart Digital Licence to ensure that the program content was
 relevant and engaging and can be implemented in the classroom with or without the use of
 technology.

About eSmart Digital Licence

The eSmart Digital Licence program expands on the existing eSmart content and platform offerings, empowering educators to deliver play-based lessons centred around the 4Cs of online safety.

Content - Learners may encounter inappropriate or harmful material online. These activities are
designed to guide learners in navigating and critically evaluating online material.



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- Contact Student contact online may involve potentially harmful interactions. These activities are
 designed to guide safe online communication, privacy settings, and the setting of internet interaction
 boundaries.
- Conduct Learners online behaviour refers to the actions and interactions engaged in while using digital platforms. These activities are designed to guide positive online behaviours and promote responsible digital citizenship.
- Compulsion Compulsion refers to excessive digital device use among learners, impacting mental
 health, academics, and social life. These activities are designed to promote healthy tech habits.

It enhances educator-led classroom experiences by providing an adaptable approach to teaching young learners (ages 4-9) essential skills for navigating the digital world safely and confidently.

- Comprehensive resource packs including teaching instructions, lesson slides, educator notes, and curriculum guides to support both experienced and novice educators
- Streamable animated videos, easily accessible from the portal, to bring learning to life on classroom smartboards
- No registration of individual sign-ins are required; educators have full control over the anonymised information they share with us for continuous improvement purposes.
